- · Long life span and minimal maintenance


Aluminium windows and doors have gained an increased market share, particularly in recent years with many new developments of flats and contemporary houses. It is rare nowadays for such modern buildings to have plastic windows installed.

Residentially there are many new and innovative aluminium products available. We now have aluminium windows designed to replace specific window systems such as old steel windows. These "Crittall Replacement" systems and hybrid (aluminium/wood composite) systems which are presently in high demand.



The finishing process of aluminium has also advanced significantly. Gone is the perception of old that aluminium was only available in silver anodised. Modern treatments are now available in over 200 colours including metallics, satins, wood effects and textured finishes such as sandstone.











The wood effect textured finish for example has a major advantage over woodgrain pvc in that it is not a foil and unlike pvc, coats every surface of the window profile.

This is a new treatment in the UK and offers an authentic aluminium alternative where the cost of real wood is prohibitive. Even down to a 45mm aluminium timber look cill with end caps to match.

Therefore, for residential installations there are many new innovative and technologically advanced products to give installers a competitive edge in the marketplace.

There is also a diverse range of tilt and turn, pivot, reversible, horizontal and vertical sliding, sliding folding doors, patio doors, french doors and roof systems all available in aluminium with the same colour, texture and thermal properties.

Commercially, aluminium remains the choice material. PVCu or composite entrance doors for example do not have the longevity of commercial aluminium doors. These types of doors can withstand the most demanding environments such as schools and unlike plastic doors can be fitted with the widest variety of handles, panic bars, exit devices, access control systems and are suitable for automatic operation.

Other aluminium products for commercial use include ground floor treatments, curtain walling, brise soleil, garage showroom sliding doors and much more.
